




Perfin "POTTER" on a six pence stamp from Great Britain from the years around 1915. Scan of the front of the stamp to the right.



This is the story of the first Harry Potter book, Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone . We begin with a presentation of the principal characters.





Harry is eleven years old and he became an orphan when he was one year old when his parents Lily and James died.









Harry loved his parents and he miss them both very much.

The stamp on the left have been strongly horizontally misperforated. The original perforation is on the far left.





Harry's parents were called Lily and James Potter.








Danish emergency coins from the Second World War (with a 1-öre stamp of wave-line type on back.) with advertising for glasses. To the left scan of the reverse side.





One of Harry Potters most distinguishing features is his glasses. The glasses are small, round, black and look kind of old-fashioned.





1.1 Harry - the principal character in the books.





Sweden Facit number 276 BBP I, from a pair out of a booklet, with printing error "injury (scar) in the forehead".





Harry's scar is under a tuft of jetblack hair over his forehead and it is a curiously shaped cut, like a bolt of lightning.



Harry got his scar when he as a young child survived the powerful evil curse from Lord Voldemort from which he's both parents died. Harry is the only survivor after the curse.

Postal label on a domestic letter to Stockholm from 1984 printed by the Swedish Post saying "Blixtbrev" which means "lightningletter" and was in use from 1975. The label was used for promoting a simplified sending of a reply.







Ron is eleven years old and he is Harry's be s t friend.



Ronald, USA 19th of June 1889. Above a scan of the stamp on the front of the letter.

Ron's full name is Ronald Bilius Weasley. His large family is a pureblooded wizard family. Ron is almost always happy and got freckles but he is also sometimes a coward and he is afraid of spiders.

Hermione is also one of Harry's best friends and she's also eleven years old. She is very clever and Harry and Ron thinks she's a prig.





Her parents is muggles (people without magical powers) and they are working as dentists.






Advertising print for dentist on the back of stamp from New Zealand from 1893.






Petunia finds Harry at the doorstep when she fetches the milk.

At the zoo Harry sees a gorilla witch he thinks looks like Dudley, except that Dudley has got blond hair.

Later they have some ice-cream in a café at the zoo.





After the lunch at the 200 they go to the reptile house. Behind the glass, all sorts of lizards and snakате crawling and slithering over bits wood and stone.





Dudley finds the biggest snake and order uncle Vernon to knock on the large glass, but the snake don't budge.

Dudley thinks that the snake is boring. Harry begins to speak in parceltoung with a boa snake. Dudley and his fiend Piers sees that and pushes Harry to the side.





Harry gets angry and makes the glass vanish. Dudley gets terrified. When the glass has vanished the snake escapes out of the cage and thanks Harry and curls away.

Normally flying letters are delivered by mail-pigeons, but in the Harry Potter books they have another way....





A few days before his eleventh birthday Harry suddenly receives a letter delivered by an owl. When Harry tries to open the letter Vernon gets very angry and takes it away from Harry.









The following days it arrives lots of letters addressed to Harry. Aunt Petunia gets really angry and even tries to destroy them in a food procurer.

All the letters which are delivered are written with green ink and are addressed to Harry. It is not clear who the sender of the letters is.

Uncle Vernon and Aunt Petunia do all they can to prevent the letters from reaching Harry.





Uncle Vernon even nails down the letter slit on the front door with a hammer.



At the Sunday Vernon was very pleased because no letters were delivered.



Vernon got really surprised when suddenly the whole house w a s flooded with letters. They c a m e whizzing down into the kitchen chimney even if it was Sunday.








Letter sent from Cobham, Surrey (number cancellation 208) to a passenger on a ship in the Suez Channel on the 25th of October 1883. The letter is sent via Port Said and Suez (on the 1st and 2nd November). The letterrate from Great Britain was two and a half pence to UPLI-countries from the 1st of July 1875 to the 30th of September in 1907 for letters with a maximum weight of 2 ounze.

All the letters had the address: Mr H. Potter, The Cupboard under the Stairs, Privet Drive 4, Little Whinging, Surrey. Vernon got crazy, gave the family 5 minutes to pack and went away with them to a hotel outside Cokeworth. They stayed for the night but the owls found them with more letters.

Vernon and the family goes to a rock island with an old shack. The night to Harry's eleventh birthday someone comes and breaks the door. It's Rubeus Hagrid keeper of the keys at Hogwarts.






From an inside pocket of his overcoat Hagrid pulled a slightly squashed box. Inside was a large, sticky cake with "Happy Birthday Harry" written on it. Fancy cancel from USA around 1875 in shape of a birthday cake.

Hagrid lit a fire in the house's fire place by conjure forth the fire.







Hagrid sat back down on the sofa, which sagged under his weight.

Printing error, the colour have been shifted down on the stamp to the left.





He began taking all sorts of things out from the pockets of his coat like a squashy package of sausages and a poker.













Hagrid also took out a copper kettle to make some tea, and several chipped mugs.


Hagrid hands over a letter to Harry which offers him to begin studying at Hogwarts. Harry accepts at once.

Then Hagrid reveals that Harry's parents did not die in a traffic accident as Vernon and Petunia told him. They died when Lord Voldemort tried to kill Harry.

Airmailletter from GB to Sweden 31st of July, in 1946 with 5 pence rate for ½ onze. In use from 15th of February in 1945 to 31st of April in 1949.




Uncle Vernon annoys Hagrid by insulting Hogwarts principal Dumbledore. Hagrid gets very angry of the insult, brings the umbrella down thru the air and conjure forth a pig's tail on Dudley's butt.



Hagrid takes up his old watch, looks at it and says that its time for him and Harry to leave.

Harry and Hagrid set out from the little rocky island in to London to buy studying material for the school start.



Hagrid tells that they are on the way to a well-known pub. When they get there Harry sees a very shabby house.


To the right: Some inns or pubs were sometimes used as postal agencies. Letter "to be left at Angel Inn in Haverford West" from the 2nd of April in 1768. Sent from Portsmouth (two line cancel in use 1729-1790) via London (Bishop's mark 4/AP) to Haverford West. The rate was 3d to London (less than 80 miles) and 4d from London to Haversford West (over 80 miles) in total 7d(the notation to the left on the cover)

Hagrid tells Harry that the name of the pub is "The Leaky Cauldron" which is on the Charing Cross Road. There are lots of people in the pub. A little man in a top hat are talking to the old barman.



The stamp below has been strongly horizontally misperforated. The original perforation is above.



In the pub many guests nods on their heads or shake hands with Harry. After that both of them goes out to the pub's backyard.










Harry and Hagrid steps outside into the small walled courtyard behind the pub.

The only things out there are a dustbin and a few weeds growing there.






Out on the courtyard Hagrid taps a brick wall three times ...





Suddenly they are in a street which seems like a new world to Harry. They are in the Diagon Alley.



... with the point of his umbrella and then the wall wriggles and a small hole appears and it growes wider to an archway.














Harry and Hagrid are first going to Gringotts Bank to collect wizard money for Harry. Hagrid hands over a gold key to the goblins who works at the Bank and asks them to show them to vault 687 and vault 713.



When they arrive to vault 687, Harry gets chocked when he sees all the gold and silver he's parents had left him. Then they are going to vault 713 from which Hagrid takes out a small parcel.

When Harry enters "Madam Malkin's Robes" to buy a uniform and a pair gloves he meets Draco Malfoy. In the end Malfoy gets angry and walks out of the store.






Hagrid gives Harry a birthday present, at Ecylops Owl Emporium Harry gets his first owl. It's a snow owl and Harry names her Hedwig.





Harry and Hagrid also buys a feather pen and a inkhorn. Then they goes to Apothecary's.



Harry and Hagrid goes to a few other stores and buys a cauldron made of pewter, a small brass scale and a telescope.











Their last stop is in Ollivander's wands store. Harry buys a wand made of holly which has a phoenix feather inside, the same type as Voldemort has.

When they decide to go home they take the London Underground from Paddington station.





Before Hagrid leaves he gives Harry a ticket for the Hogwarts Express.





Harry asks his uncle to qive lift. He an swers: -Magic carpets all got punctures, have they? Harry goes to King's Cross Station.

At Kings Cross Station Harry searches for platform nine and three-quarters but he can't find it.





Harry sees a family with children and suitcases which he understands are wizards. Harry asks them and they tell him to walk at the barrier between platforms nine and ten.





He starts to walk towards the barrier with his trolley and suddenly he's at platform nine and three-quarters where the Hogwarts Express is waiting.








In Great Britain, the Post Office monopoly only applies to letters, not parcels. Railways carried parcels from 1850. These railwaystamps were used in the 1930s. Office A and Office J were different places where stamps could be purchased. Price was by weight. Ex. Francis Kiddle.



The Hogwarts Express looks like a big dark red steam train. Red smoke from the engine drifted over their heads. The train always departure from Kings Cross station.





The stamps above have been strongly misperforated.



The train take the Hogwartsstudents to and from the school every year.

After a while on the train a lady comes in with a candy barrow. Ron says that he brought some sandwiches. But Harry remembers that he got some money and buys one of each sort.











Ron tells Harry every name on the wizard candy he bought. For ex: Pumpkin Pasties, Cauldron Cakes and Droobles Best Bubblegum.



The different kinds of candy isn't like ours. Another example is the wizard candy Liquorice Wands.














In the boxes with Chocolate Frogs there are always a collecting card with a famous witch or wizard enclosed.














The cards in the boxes are very popular to collect among the students at Hogwarts.



2.5 The Journey from Platform Nine and Three-Quarters.














They take their black school coats on and make themselves ready to get off the train.









The first year students goes over the "Black Lake" to Hogwarts. Harry, Ron, Hermione and Neville sits in the same boat. On the foreparts of the boats there were big lanterns to light their way.



On the pair to the right have the red colour been displaced. To the far right a pair with normal printing to compare with.








Postal form number 4 6 from June in 1930 with a lead seal the from post-office in Malmö 1 Luft used on a mailbag for airmail letters sent to Bruxelles in Belgium.



When the first year students were entering the Great Hall, Harry did not feel alright. He felt like his legs were heavy as lead.

When Harry caught sight of an old pointed wizard's hat on a stool and he thought that they maybe would conjure a rabbit out of it.



And then, the first year students were subordinated in the different houses by the Sortinghat.





The houses are: Gryffindor, Hufflepuff, Ravenclaw and Slytherin. Harry, Ron and Hermione were subordinated into the house Gryffindor.



3.1 Harry Arrives to Hogwarts and The Selection with the Sorting Hat.


At the Sorting Ceremony the students have to try on a hat which calls out witch House the students is sorted to.




After the selection, a grand dinner awaits them all.




There are 142 staircases at Hogwarts which all can move. In nearly all corridors stands armours. The teacher in Transfiguration is professor McGonagall. When Harry and Ron arrives late to their first lesson she transforms herself form a cat to a human.










At the Transfiguration they get a match each to turn into a needle.





The postal plane flying between Stockholm ad Stralsund crashed against a mountain near Waldemarsvik in the night of 6th to the 7th of August 1930. The vreck the plane was recovered by divers but the mail was heavily damaged by water. A special label was applied by the postoffice in Stockholm.

Harry's friend Seamus Finnigan tries to conjure a glass of water into rum. He tries with the magic formula: "Eyes from rabbit witchcraft come, transform my water to pure rum".










Severus Snape is Hogwarts potions master who's hated by everyone except the Sfytherins. He's described like a bat when he sweeps in his black cloak and has got his first name from the roman emperor Septimus Serverus.









The first thing Snape does when he meets Harry and the other new students is to ask Harry lots of questions. He says to Harry: - What would I get if I added powdered root of asphodel to an infusion of wormwood? Harry doesn't now.



 What is the difference between monkshood and wolfsbane? Harry doesn't now this either.

Then they had to mix a simple potion to cure boils. Snape watched while they weigh dried nettles and crush snake fangs. To complete the potion they also had to add some horned slugs.

Professor Flitwick is very keen on that the pupils are doing the right things. "Now, don't forget that nice wrist movement we've been practising! Swish and flick and saying the magic words properly is very important". Seamus Finnegan had an accident and his feather caught fire.

The pupils uses the charm Wingardium Leviosa to having the feather to levitate.







Filius Flitwick is Charms Master at Hogwarts. He is a dwarf and very short and fie often sits on a pile books so he can his see students.


At their first Charms lesson the students learn how to make things levitate. They practise on how to make a feather levitate with a charm.



Feather letter with white feather sent with the Crown mail from Vånga to Odensberg in Sweden on the 2nd of March 1861. With delivery notations: "Quickly to the head of the County Constabulary Mr A.E. Falk, containing a summons in a criminal case. To be delivered by Crown mailman ..."







Harry is having bacon for breakfast in the Great Hall. Suddenly the mail owls flies in and deliver a parcel to Harry together with a letter which tells him not to open the parcel until after breakfast.





Cancellation from Uggelbo in Sweden 1870, which means owls nest in English.



The owls (which are barn owls) returns to their owls nest. The parcel contains a brand new Nimbus 2000 broomstick. It's from professor McGonagall who wants Harry to be Seeker in Gryffindors Quidditch team.

Notification of a small parcel on postal form number 168 sent from Gamleby, August, 1st 1875. Only a few forms of this type are known.







On the Hallowe'en evening all students sit down and eat dinner in the Great Hall at Hogwarts.







In the Great Hall there are bats, flying pumpkins and candles everywhere in the air. The house ghosts are also flying around.



In the middle of the dinner when Harry was eating a oven baked potato professor Quirrell comes running and gasped: - Troll in the dungeons!



Harry and Ron immediately runs away to the girl's toilet to find Hermione. She went there because she was sad after being teased by Ron .

the girl's toithey meet the troll which is totally out of it's mind. The troff knocks down the sinks and destroys the whole toilet with his big club.


Ron saves them by using magic which makes the troll's club to knock down the troll while Harry sticks his wand up one of the trolls nostrils.




Printing error on a 5 öre Oscar II which is called "deep nostril".

When the teachers comes Harry sees that Snape has been bitten in one of his legs.










Quidditch is easy enough to understand, even if it's not too easy to play. There are seven players flying their broomsticks on each side. Three of them are called Chasers.










The Chasers tries to throw the Quaffle to each other and get it through one of the hoops to score goals which are protected by the teams Keeper. The Bludgers rocket around and tries knock the players off their broomsticks.





That's wfty you have two Beaters each team who tries to protect their side from the Bludgers and tries to and knock them towards the other team. The last member of the team is the Seeker who is trying to catch the Golden Snitch. If the Seeker catch it the team gets 150 expoints the and match over. Harry is Gryffindor's Seeker.



Harry and Ron stays at Hogwarts over Christmas. They were getting prepared to enter the library's "Restricted Section" for which a certificate usually was required for the students. The reason for going there was that they wanted to find some information about a person named Nicolas Flamel.




Harry brought a lantern with a candle. He was hiding under the magic invincible cloak.

Full pane of 4 cent chair with the printing error "white line on the top of the USA and the headrest of the chair."

Harry had to run away because he was almost caught for being out late at night. While he was running away through the corridors at Hogwarts he found a disused classroom.



When Harry entered the classroom he saw the dark shapes of old desks and chairs that were piled against the walls and on the floor there was an upturned waste-paper basket.

They go back using the Invisible Cloak which are making them disappear. Harry had earlier seen his dead parents in the mirror of Erised but Ron sees totally different things.

Propped against the wall facing him is a large mirror. The mirror's name is the Mirror of Erised. When Harry looks into it he sees his whole family standing beside him. Later Harry shows the mirror to Ron.




Dumbledore explains to Harry that if you stand in the front of the mirror it shows the deepest desire of your heart.






Norbert was born out of a green egg. One night when the three friends tried to smuggle Norbert out of the school for Hagrid they were discovered.





Testing label in green design on a local registered letter sent from Willesden on the 27th of April in 1937. The label is often called "poached egg".



Norbert is a Norwegian green ridgeback dragon. Hagrid won the dragon egg in a card game the previous night from a black hooded stranger in the local pub The Hog's Head.

Preliminary, rough sketch-draft designed and signed by the artist Throstur Magnusson for Icelandic stamps issued in 1987, 1988 and 1990 depicting a dragon. The dragon is one of the four quardian spirits in the national coat-of-arms of Iceland. The sketch above is an early stage of creating the final design with an extra focus by the artist on the dragon's leg.



Centaurs are half horse and half human. They are also often armed with crossbows or bows.








Left: Letter to Alicante in Spain with 40 centimes rate. Sent from Paris on the 11th of November in 1863. The postmark is a star cancellation number "4".



They come through down the trapdoor and lands on a huge plant called The Devil's Snare which twists them.






Harry who's very good at ffying manages to catch the key they are looking for. With he-lp of the key they unlocks the door and gets further into the next room.

Harry comes in and sees professor Quirrell who ties Harry up with a rope.


